Graduates of the State Normal School

The State Normal School opened in DeFuniak Springs in October 1887 and closed in 1905. At the time of its closure, female students were sent to the Florida State College for Women in Tallahassee (now Florida State University) and male students were transferred to the University of Florida in Gainesville. An asterisk (*) indicates the person was deceased when the following list was published circa 1902.

Lake Victoria

One of the 1891 graduates of the State Normal School apparently had a local lake named for her.

In March 1972, Anna Reardon contributed a short article to the *DeFuniak Springs Herald*, stating that one of the twin lakes in western DeFuniak Springs known as Back Lake had been named Lake Victoria over 80 years before.

Victoria Halse [*sic*] was one of the renowned singers at the Florida Chautauqua and it seemed appropriate to name a beautiful body of water for her, so it was done.

Miss Victoria Hulse was the niece of Dr. C. A. Landrum, Sr., a pioneer physician of DeFuniak Springs. . . . Her mother was Mrs. Sarah Landrum Hulse. She was related to Judge and Mrs. Reeves who lived in Pensacola later. . . . Mrs. Reeves was a teacher at the Florida State Normal School. . . .

African American Gateway - The African American Gateway is a growing resource for African American research and includes information from the United States, Canada, and the Caribbean, and well as a few other countries. The links to websites in this gateway are paired with a bibliography of resources for African American research in The Genealogy Center collection of the Allen County (Indiana) Public Library.

"Ask Granny's" Book of Genealogical Quotations - An entertaining online booklet about the struggles of research and writing.

Georgia State Archives Closing - Effective November 1, 2012, the Georgia State Archives located in Morrow will be closed to the public due to budget cuts. Georgia will be the only state in the country that will not have a central location in which the public can visit to research and review the historical records of their government and state. The staff that currently works to catalog, restore, and provide reference to the state of Georgia's permanent historical records will be reduced. After November 1st, the public will only be allowed to access the building by appointment; however, the number of appointments could be limited based on the schedule of the remaining employees.

Native American Gateway - The Native American Gateway is a resource for those exploring First Nations family history. Information on how to begin such research and links to materials from the National Archives and popular data are complemented by a continually updated listing of resources held by The Genealogy Center collection of the Allen County (Indiana) Public Library.

Our Military Heritage - Our Military Heritage includes images of books, pamphlets, government documents, original letters, diaries, biographies, photographs, videos, unit histories, and rosters as well as service and pension records. A project of The Genealogy Center of the Allen County (Indiana) Public Library, this collection of data files offers materials from the Colonial era through the Afghanistan and Iraqi Wars. Contributions of additional data are most welcome.

World War II Airman Identified - Defense Department forensic scientists identified the remains of 2nd Lt. Samuel E. Lunday of Marianna, an airman lost in action during World War II, They returned his remains to his family for burial with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery. Lunday disappeared with four other crewmen flying in a C-87 Liberator Express cargo aircraft from Yangkai, China, to their base at Chabua, India, on April 24, 1943. Rescuers were unable to locate the crash site due to heavy snow in the Himalayan Mountains and dense jungle canopy along the crew's assumed flight route. In 2003, an American hiker stumbled upon the mountainous crash site, roughly 100 miles short of the base at Chabua, near the Indian border with Burma. The hiker recovered the aircraft's identification placard and human remains that led to Lunday's identification.
