Pinterest for Genealogy

<u>Pinterest.com</u> is a website that allows people to "pin" images from websites and computers to "boards" with themes. A pin is simply a copy of an image you have found elsewhere. The advantage of using Pinterest is that it allows you to group likeitems together so you can view them as one collage of images.

Run a search for the word *genealogy* on Pinterest, and you will find it has many helpful sections, including printables, charts, organization tips, and tutorials. Among the pins are links to many free e-books and websites. To visit the original source of the pin, simply click on the website listed under "Pinned from."

You might want to start by browsing through the boards that are called "Genealogy" for a multitude of possibilities, or see Places My Ancestors Lived and Genealogy Jessop for some ideas. You can also use Pinterest as a place to capture all of your favorite genealogy websites. If you especially like a board, you can "follow" that board to have its most recent pins featured on your Pinterest home page.

1830

West Florida Walton County Oct. 7th 1830

To His Excellency the Governor

Sir we the subscribers do hereby certify that at an Election held in the first District in said County on the first Saturday in Sept. last for Officers to command a volunteer Militia Company the following were elected Viz. Thos. J. Snowden Captain

Reuben N. Barrow 1st Lieut.

Taskill McCaskill 2nd Lieut.

for which your honour will please to forward a commission

<u> 1846</u>

According to an August 11, 1846, letter Angus Campbell recommended the following appointments in the militia since an election had not been held. Angus Campbell was the Colonel commanding the Second Regiment, First Brigade, Florida Militia.

1852

Ucheeanna Fla. Nov. 10th 1852

To the Governor of Florida

Sir agreeable to an election held on the 2nd day of November 1852 to elect one Colonel in place of Colonel Campbell resigned, I have this day canvassed the votes and find that the whole number of votes given was one hundred and seventy two (172) votes, and out of that number David Barcly Recvd nine votes (9) and Samuel McQuagg recvd fifty five votes (55) and Benjamin F. Lee Recvd one hundred and eight votes (108) so you will see that Benjamin F. Lee is elected such Colonel.

You will send on his commission as soon as possible.

1860
