



1900 Postcard

There is another postcard, similar to the one on the right above, for Glen Ray Jones, who died on September 21, 1923. Funeral homes and/or cities are not listed for either one. According to a 2008 interview in <u>Collectors Weekly</u> with a postcard collector, postcards were especially popular in the early 1900s before magazines had a lot of pictures in them. They were that time's version of our text messages because mail delivery was more frequent then. "They often had two mail deliveries a day to your house, and trains went everywhere several times a day, so you could send a postcard to the next town in the morning and tell people you were coming by train the next day in the afternoon. It was a way to get short, quick messages to people."

Honoring Our Military

Two Walton County cemeteries traditionally honor military members on Memorial Day. This year's services will be on Monday, May 30. Thanks to <u>Walton Outdoors</u> for the following information.

Gum Creek Cemetery 21st Annual Memorial Day Service, 8:00 a.m.

Gum Creek Cemetery, one of the oldest in Walton County, is thought to be at least 160 years old. It marks the final resting place of veterans from American's wars all the way back to the early 19th Century, with 12 known Civil War veterans and one confirmed Seminole War veteran. There are many veterans from 20th century conflicts, from World War I throughout the Korean War, buried in the cemetery as well. The cemetery is north of DeFuniak Springs, just off of SR-83 North. Gulf Cemetery, Santa Rosa Beach, 10:00 a.m.

The cemetery is located on land granted by the United States Government and signed by President Woodrow Wilson on June 17, 1914. It has a rich history tied to the local community. Many community leaders, veterans, and other notable locals are buried at Gulf Cemetery, which is located on CR-393 South.
